

FATHER CLARK GOES TO ATHENS

**The Classic City Will Have
Its First Resident
Pastor.**

Father H. F. Clark, who has been attached to the Immaculate Conception parish staff for a year, will be busy the first part of the week bidding his many Atlanta friends good-bye, as he will leave the city Thursday for Athens to take charge of the Catholic congregation in that city as the first resident priest the classic city has ever had.

Though yet in his 20's, Father Clark has proven himself an energetic, tireless worker for his church, and is looked upon as a young man of great promise and as a churchman from

whom much is expected. Thoroughly educated, a hard student, a deep thinker, an interesting and forceful speaker, with a pleasant personality. Father Clark devotes all these talents to the work to which he has consecrated his life.

A native of Pennsylvania, he was educated at Dunwoodie Seminary, at Yonkers, N. Y., and was ordained at St. Patrick's cathedral in New York City in June, '09, by Bishop Cusick. He was immediately assigned to parish work in Savannah, where he remained four months, when he was transferred to mission work in Albany. A year ago he was assigned to mission work in the Immaculate Conception parish in Atlanta, and here attracted the attention of Bishop Kelley, by whom he was assigned to Athens.
